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Navarrenx's tranquil appearance belies a rich and powerful history.

The town has a very important strategic position. Marguerite de Moncade gave it the status of Bastide in 1316.


In the 16th century Henri d'Albret, grandfather of the future king Henri IV, decided to fortify the town. He wanted to protect Béarn from the greedy clutches of Spain and France.

An Italian architect, Fabricio Sicilano, built here the first fortified town in France, based on the Italian model. The recently completed ramparts proved themselves in 1569 during an attempt to annexe Béarn by the French troops of Charles IX.

Thanks to the resistance of Navarrenx, ever loyal to Jeanne d'Albret under the command of Baron d'Arros, Béarn was able to maintain its sovereignty. The fortifications are still intact and take you on a journey through time.

Along your walk, you can admire "the most beautiful visages of France": caricatures of the town's shopkeepers and inhabitants.

"I'm attracted by the beauty of the majestic ramparts... ...Well, I'd take you to the canon because from there you get a 360° view of Navarrenx - S' Antoine's gate leading to Spain, the bridge over the Gave d'Oloron, famous for its salmon, the isle of Charron, and the Pyrenees, snowcapped in winter and green in summer.

Then you turn around and see the gunpowder house and the village rooftops!"

Leaving the tourist office (1), you will see ST-Antoine's Barracks (1) ancient military barracks built after the fortifications to accommodate up to 500 soldiers. In front of you, is ST Antoine's Gate (2), one of the only two ancient gates of the city. This gate is protected by an "orillon" and provides shelter from direct artillery fire. Built at the same time as the ramparts, the gate was accessed by a drawbridge, if you look up you will see the two recesses for the drawbridge chains.

Return to S¹ Antoine's Barracks, on your right, you will see the former military prison. Take the steps on the right, and you will reach the **terrace (3)**, which faces the Gave of Oloron, famous for its salmon. On top of the 13th century bridge, there was a sentry tower. Directly to your right you can make out the foundations of the Castérasse, a former castle of the Earls of Béarn. In the middle, the military well made it possible to pull up the drawbridge. Facing the river, above the orillon, the "échauguette" (sentry box) served for surveillance and defence.

Leave this part of the ramparts and few yards on you arrive at the **bastion of the bell (4)** protector of the bridge and the S^t Antoine gate. This is a lovely viewpoint. A copy of one of the cannons reminds us of the system of defence between the bastions. This cannon named "Si You ti baü" is named after the motto of the city, a Béarnaise cry exclamation which means "If I go there."

Head towards the "Poudrière" (5) which is the only gunpowder store in the square. It was built in 1580 to free up space in the side-aisle of the church that had previously served that purpose. It can hold up to 25 000 pounds of explosives. The beautiful interior vault allows sound to echo diagonally, from corner to corner - do try it out!

Next take "rue St-Antoine" where you will find **Jeanne** d'Albret's house (6). It's a beautiful renaissance house. The door is situated within an elliptical arch topped with a triangular pediment. In 1555 Jeanne d'Albret

became queen of Navarre and of Béarn. She adopted the calvinist religion and Béarn became part of a small group of protestant nations.

Carry on toward the S'-Germain's church [7]. The church has a turbulent history. It was completed in 1562; Jeanne d'Albret converted it to a Protestant church. In 1620, Louis XIII gave it back to the Catholic church. You will notice that the vaults and arches are decorated with sculpted heads, one of which is of a Compostella pilgrim. This illustrates the importance of the chemin du Puy to Navarrenx. Displayed in the porch are copies of the beautiful invoice for three from paintings produced by Murillo, Dubois and Carrache which were presented by Emperor Napoleon III during his visit. As is traditional in the region the church has a special door for the Cagots, who were numerous in the Navarrenx area.

On leaving the church, go up to "rue des échos" until you reach the **Bastion of «Contremines» (8)** which has the distinctive feature of an underground gallery. To visit it you take the stairs down to the bottom. You will need a torch. By following "le chemin de Ronde" you reach **Bastion of echos (9)**, It protected the S¹-Germain gate which has now been destroyed. It's an example of a primitive fortification without orillons or covered flanks. The openings on the right hand side echo seven times. The steep staircase on the right leads to the Potern of l'Abbatoir which served as an escape route in case of attack.

Turn right again on «rue des Echos» and carry on up to the military fountain (10) which was converted at the same time as the ramparts. This, during that area, was the only source of water in the town. It was essential in times of siege. After closing in 1952, after a typhoid epidemic, it was reopened and restored in 1989.

Finally follow "rue de la Fontaine" and "rue de la prison" towards L'Arsenal (11). This ancient home of the Kings of Navarre was transformed into a storehouse for weapons, ammunition and rations. Today it's the cultural and tourist centre of the town.



Salies-de-Béarn The city of salt



This small town owes its fame to alt and salt has shaped its history.


Its discovery was attributed to a wild boar that was found next to a spring with its bristles covered in salt. Since then, Salies has looked after its treasures. It is an inexhaustible spring of salt water which provides health and well being. It still belongs to 500 Salisiens known as Part-Prenants.

This tradition has carried on since 1587.



There are two quarters; the oldest like the shape of a snail's shell unfolds from the salt well. Here you can find typical houses of the 17th and 18th centuries and narrow streets decked with flowers. In these streets, you'll discover the Museum of Salt and Béarnais Tradition. Nearby, the Thermal quarter has a totally different feel. You are immersed in the Belle Epoque

• era with the Moorish style Spa, the band stand and the splendid Hotel du Parc, which houses the Salies casino. Together they ooze an old-fashioned charm which appeals to visitors.

"My favourite view is definitely the one from the "Pont de la Lune"... ... I always stop there as in my opinion it is THE postcard of Salies. The view of houses on pillars, the river bed, the Marrou house completely restored by its owner.

In the background, the bell tower and steeple of St Vincent's Church draw the eye upwards. A perfect composition, ever changing in different lights and weather... I never tire of it!"



Starting from the Tourist Office (), next to the Town Hall, you will find the Fountain of the Sanglier (Boar) (1), erected in its honour. It tells the story of a wild boar which was injured during a boar hunt. It was discovered dead a few days later in a marsh with its bristles sprinkled with salt. This monument carries the slogan of Salies-de-Béarn "Si you nou y eri mourt arès n'y bibéré" - if I had not died no one would live here

Under the arcades of the **Town Hall (2)** rebuilt in 1810, you'll find an information board and a video about the history of the city of salt. The ground floor houses temporary exhibitions.

At the heart of the "Cite du Sel", the "place du Bayaà" [3] has stood over the saline spring since 1865. This underground basin is called the Crypt even though it has nothing to do with religion. It was built for reasons of hygiene in order to protect the saline spring. Nowadays it is open to the public (details from the Tourist Office). It possesses a beautiful stone vault supported by 1-metre-wide pillars. They are supported by an eight-metre pile foundation of chestnut wood. In the square at the corner of the town hall on the first floor flourish the headquarters of the Corporation of the Part-Prenants direct descendants of the "besis", the original owners of the well since 1587.

In "rue de la Fontaine Salée", on the facade of the cobbler, you can admire **the bas relief (4)** which relates the visit of Jeanne d'Albret to Salies in 1568. Take "rue pont Mayou". At number 8 you will find "**coulédé" (5)**. This stone trough, which is now covered, held the salt water which was carried there in the traditional wooden buckets. The water, drawn from the basin in "Place du Bayaà" was carried to the workshop in "sameaux" 92-litre wooden containers. Carry on to the left, "rue des Voisins", then right, "rue du Griffon" and on to the end of "rue du Saleys". Notice, on your right, "rue Loumé" with its pretty floral displays. At the end of "rue du Saleys" turn right into "rue des Puis Salants".

The **Salt and Béarnais Traditions' Museum (6)** is housed in the three storeys of a typical 17th century house, recently renovated. You discover a workshop of a salt manufacturer and a rich collection of items evoking the history of Salies and Béarnaise traditions from their origins up until the present day. Opposite the museum is **the Bourg House (7)**, owned by the "Amis de Vieux Salies". You can consult their archives and documents here.

Head towards the "place de la Trompe" then "rue du Moulin", on the right "rue Elysée Coustère" and "rue Larroumette" and you will see the "Château S'-Pé [8]". which was rebuilt

DE-BEARN

at the end of the 16th century. In the 17th century, witchcraft trials were held here. Nowadays it's a private house. Straight ahead, take the alley, then the gallery, on the right which brings you out "impasse Argenton". You are now in front of **the house of Michel de Bergeras (9)** "Maitre Charpentier" a cabinetmaker of the École de Salies which developed between the 18th and 19th centuries. He is said to have been descended from the Cagots, pariahs in the Pyrenees up until the Revolution.

At the end of "I'Impasse Argenton", turn right, cross the "pont de la Lune" over the bed of the Saleys river and admire at half-timbered houses on pillars [10] including the "maison Marrou" with its wooden galley and suspended bread oven. Follow rue d'Église and you'll reach St-Vincent's church [11]. Its bell tower, a former watchtower, played its part in a system of fortifications long since disappeared.

A few steps further on you, leave the Old town by the Quai de Saleys and you reach the thermal quarter. The high days of thermalism at the end of the 19th century and the beginning of the 20th century saw great hotels and palaces flourish. Cross the public garden with its band stand (12) and you will see in front of you the, Thermal Baths [13]. The first building was constructed in 1857 and was destroyed by a fire. It was rebuilt in Moorish style in 1888. The west wing is reserved for therapy. The benefits of the water help to heal gynaecological, rheumatological and paediatric complaints. The opposite wing houses "Les Bains de la Mude", a fitness centre with up to date installations which mix pleasure with well being. New! sensory journey through the "Grotte de Sel" (Salt Grotto) and the "Lagon de la Mer Morte" (Dead Sea Lagoon). Imagine fin-de-siècle artists and poets such as Paul-Jean Toulet on the terrace of Café Cercle du Chalet (14)

Be sure to go into the "Hôtel du Parc", built in 1983 with its splendid entrance hall in the form of reversed nave. Since December 1999, it has housed the Salies' Casino (15), gaming tables, slot machines, a restaurant and a three star hotel. Head toward the "quartier de la Gare", follow "avenue Gabriel Graner" and then on your right, "avenue Jacques Dufourcq", you find the salt manufacturing plant (16). This is where the Salies Salt (IGP), pure white and 100% natural, is extracted from the Oraàs salt water spring. Bayonne ham must be salted with this salt and no other in order to receive the label "Indication Géographique Protégée".









... The works of man ooze with force and nobility amongst the splendour of nature. The dreams and reflections of travellers know no limits." This is how Léon Bérard (academician and Mayor during the thirties) described the "pearl of Béarn".

Welcome to a land fashioned by legends. It is a land of mystery that invites discovery. Let your curiosity carry you away for an hour, a day or even longer. Here the slightest detour tells a tale.

This is an ancient moated camp strongly defended inside its stonewalls. Over the centuries it contributed to the maintenance of the sovereignty of Béarn. The gateway to Spain at the foot of the Pyrenees, Sauveterre is surrounded by picturesque countryside.

Since the $10^{\rm th}$ and $11^{\rm th}$ centuries pilgrims passing through here have always been greeted with hospitality.

"Without doubt the Datter gateway is my favourite spot even if it is a little bit tucked away!...

... You enter or leave the old centre of Sauveterre via this historic gateway which was once strongly defended. Above the archway was a look-out post for the guards. Imagine walking over the drawbridge covering the deep ditch. At night, this drawbridge was raised to prevent entry and to protect the town.

I love the idea of passing through from the Medieval town to the river Oloron, from nowadays back to the past.



Walk in the medieval city

Start your walk on the esplanade of the **Town Hall (1)** that has as backdrop splendid views of the superb chain of the Pyrenees. This edifice, in renaissance style, was the property of the family of the Marquis de Nays, Earls of Salettes from the 16th century. The town purchased it in 1972.

In front of you stands St André's church (2) constructed at the end of the 12th century. There is a mixture of architectural styles. The imposing semi-circular chevet framed by two chapels harmoniously supports the building. Roman influence dominates with beautiful sober facades with only three long, narrow windows piercing the wall. The northern wall is worth a detour with its reverse chrism, its angled tower and its rose window. Unusually, St André's church was fortified. This is proved by the fact that its beautiful bell tower was crenelated. It played an important part in the defence of the city. On the southern facade, overlooking the river you find the Cagots' door. The Cagots were also called crestiaas.

Mystery surrounds this population, which was rejected by the Béarnais people. Nobody knows the reason. Were they descended from lepers, Visigoths or Saracens? Finally above the main door the tympan displays some magnificent stonework. It shows a majestic figure of Christ flanked by four apostles in their symbolic form. The interior illustrates the transition in style from roman to gothic. The central nave is vaulted with beautiful lancet arches. Notice the tales told by the two columns. The first, adjoining the transept represents lies and greed. The second in the north aisle shows a nativity.

At the bottom of "la place des Salières" is the "Monréal Tower" [3]. Its name is due to the family that purchased it in order to save it from destruction, in the 19th century. This defensive tower, dating from the 13th century is 33 metres high. It is built with Bidache stone, as is the church. The facade is interspersed with arches and bay windows on the southern side. Nowadays it houses an astonishing model of the city as well as an exhibition explaining Sauveterre in the Middle Ages.

Take the stairs and at the bottom of the tower turn right then take the footpath that leads to the fortified bridge named The "Bridge of

the Legend" (4). Built under Gaston VII Moncade during the 13th century then remodelled under Febus in the 14th century, it's the route towards the kingdom of Navarre. Originally equipped with a drawbridge it provides access to the "île de la Glère". During the 18th century, a violent rise in the water level washed away part of the bridge and gave it its current appearance. It takes its name from the legend of Queen Sancie, in 1170, she was subjected to a terrible judgement of God in the presence of three thousand people. Accused of having killed her newborn son she was thrown, hands and feet tied together, into the river. The crowd waited anxiously until the sovereign drowned. But it didn't happen! She floated to the surface and the current carried her to the bank. Queen Sancie, now proved innocent. was acclaimed by the public, and transported with joy.

Carry on along the footpath which runs alongside the campsite and you can reach the "île de la Glère" and admire its flora which has been protected and preserved.

Climb up again taking the "Lester's Gate" (5). The upper part of this medieval bridge no longer exists; it has been replaced by a footbridge. The thickness of the walls does, however, testify to the town's fortifications.

Next, take "rue Pléguignou" to the "Strong House" (6). On the left you find the Arsenal (7), now renovated as a dwelling house. It served as a warehouse for weapons. It is linked with the beautiful fortified "Datter's Gate" (8) which opens on to the town from the west. Even nowadays it has preserved its arched form. In the past the upper brackets supported the ramparts and the chamber housing the mechanisms of the drawbridge, which was needed to cross the deep ditch encircling the town.

Retrace your steps to reach the "rue des Innocents". In passing, you will notice the remains of "the Viscount's Castle" (9). Probably constructed by Gaston VII Moncade, it was remodelled by Gaston Febus and became both his residence and hunting lodge. Polygonal in dressed stone, it was largely destroyed in the 16th century. Finally turn to your right and return to the church by "rue Léon Bérard".

Exploring the surrounding villages and countryside is also a treat for anyone interested in history.

Land of history



During the Middle Ages, Béarn was right at the heart of the many turbulent events.

Gaston Phébus, prince of the Pyrenees had a vision of an independent kingdom stretching from the Atlantic to the Mediterranean.

He built defences throughout the region of which Sauveterre-de-Béarn is an excellent example.

The fortified stone town wall ensured that Béarn was able to retain its sovereignty over many centuries.



An amazing transformation took place in the town when Henri II d'Albret brought Italian architect Fabricio Siciliano to the town to oversee the construction of its ramparts.

It's thanks to these fortifications that Navarrenx was able to resist attacks from Catholic troops against the Protestant troops. In fact, in the 16th century the Béarn was the only region of France where Calvinism was the official religion: Jeanne d'Albret, Henry IV's mother, was the sovereign.



A legend says that Queen Jeanne d'Albret used to take the waters in Salies-de-Béarn, a city famous thanks to its water ten times saltier than sea water.

The city centre reveals the medieval architecture such as the little streets that interlace to form a snail shell.

Salt, a natural resource

In the Middle Ages, Saliesde-Béarn developed and derived its name from its own natural treasure: salt. Legend says that Salies' salt was discovered when a wild boar was found covered with white salt. Intensive exploitation of the salt in medieval times brought economic prosperity to the town.

Since 1587, Salies has had a unique, economic and social organisation named "la Corporation des Part-prenants" which is still in existence.

Salt-production in Salies was industrialised in the nineteenth century, and the Saline (Salt Works) now produce 2,000 tonnes of salt a year. The salt from Salies is the only salt allowed in the production of genuine Bayonne ham ("Jambon de Bayonne").

The Salt Works may be viewed from the exterior free of charge. You will be provided with boards which tell you everything you need to know about the plant and the processes involved in the crystallisation of the salt water. At certain times you can also see the harvesting of salt by hand (Opening times vary according to production schedules).

Museum area: with an audio guide in English you will learn about the history of the Saline (the wild boar legend, growth of the town, etc.).

The visit ends by tasting the salted Bayonne ham with spring salt from the Salines de Salies-de-Béarn.

The Crypt

Nearby

In 1292 Countess Marguerite de Moncade founded Labastide Villefranche. Traces of its bastide Character can still be seen. The Town Hall was built incorporating the arches. In the 14th century a fortified tower was constructed and its ruins still overlook the Pounte lake.

The village of **Lahontan** meaning "the fountain" possesses three fountains to which miraculous healing powers have been attributed. The Chapelle Notre Dame d'Abet was erected in the Middle Ages after the discovery in a copse of a statue of the virgin Mary.



Defensive architecture

The architectural heritage of Béarn des Gaves bears testimony to troubled times during the Middle Ages. Sauveterre-de-Béarn and Navarrenx have all preserved elements of their fortifications.

The «Pont de la Légende» and the «tour Monréal» in **Sauveterre-de-Béarn**, were part of the town's hillside defence. Thanks to these buildings and its environment, **Sauveterre-de-Béarn** is recognised as a «Petite Cité de Caractère».

Navarrenx is remarkable in terms of its fortifications. Built in the 16^{th} century, it still has its imposing ten-meter-high ramparts, listed as Historic Monuments.

The defence bastions, as well as various military buildings such as the Arsenal and the Saint-Antoine barracks, have earned Navarrenx one of the highest accolades - it is one of the "Most beautiful villages in France".

The nearby village of **Audaux**, has preserved and restored its communal village laundry, opposite the church of S^t Vincent. The Château de Gassion in the village was built between the 12th and 13th centuries but was partly burned down in 1560 during the religious wars. The present building dates back to 1650 and is now home to a private school.

You can see some different styles of Béarnais architecture in the village of **Castetnau-Camblong** and note the stone bridges in the surrounding area dating back to Roman times

A French internment camp created in March 1939 to hold fighters of the Spanish Republican army, notably the Basques.

Later used as a prison for "undesirables" during the Vichy regime and a deportation point for foreign Jews who had taken refuge in France.

Visit the reception building, National memorial, tribute stele for the Righteous among the nations, memory path and an historical path which passes through a shack rebuilt exactly as it was in 1939. Walk the Internees' Path, where 27 granite columns that pay tribute to each category of internee.

Located at the historical entrance of the camp, which is on the way to L'hôpital Saint Blaise.


Gaston Fébus hunted in the woods around **Hopital d'Orion**, which takes its name from the word "espitau", a place which welcomed pilgrims passing through on the way to Santiago de Compostela.

The 12th century fortified church of **S¹ Gladie** has a bell tower and has a similar design to that of the main town, Sauveterre-de-Béarn.

Laàs, a Principality? Well, there is a Customs Post at the entry to the village! But don't worry, the barrier is always open and you will always be welcome in the Principality of Laàs! You may smile but this is serious! You can stroll along a Hollywood - style Walk of Fame - « Laàs-Vegas Boulevard » with its 33 stars in homage to celebrities who have performed at the annual Transhumance Music Festival. Laàs may be pocket-sized but this charming Béarnais village has become quite famous. Make a day of it with a meal at the Auberge and a visit to a master cabinetmaker or a pottery studio. Or if you'd like to stay a while, why not book a room at the Auberge or rent a gite?

Have a wander around the main square, admire the sundials and marvel at the signposts in Laàs, at the crossroad of the world...

On the paths of the Camino de Santiago

Three of the four principal routes used by the pilgrims pass through the Béarn des Gaves : the Vézelay Route, the Puy-en-Velay Route and the Tours Route.

The salt has been exploited since the Bronze Age. The salty source is still the property of the descendants from the first families who have lived in the village since the Middle Ages.

Bayonne Ham has its special quality label thanks to Salies salt.

The Fleur de Sel (fine surface crust) is collected by hand to protect its lightness. Sprinkled on grills and fresh vegetables, it will seduce your taste buds.

Every year, Salt is celebrated on the second Sunday of September at the Salt Festival.

The Blonde d'Aquitaine is a cross of 3 breeds of cattle local to the South West, the "garonnaise", the "guercy" and the "pyreneenne". It has a quiet temperament with good fertility and longevity. Its maternal instincts guarantee the calves grow well under the mother. Muscular, powerful and wellrounded with a fine skeleton, the meat is excellent and you can savour it in good restaurants in Béarn des Gaves.

The "Foire de la blonde d'Aquitaine" held in Sauveterre-de-Béarn in mid-August is not to be missed!



Duck

The best-seller of the South West, duck features everywhere in Béarn des Gaves - as foie gras, magret, confit and more. Do try «garbure», a thick vegetable soup with morsels of duck!



Ossau-Iraty cheese

Cheesemakers making ewe cheese known as Ossau-Iraty are situated in the Béarn & Pays Basque, so share the same landscape, similar terrain and even expertise.

They follow a strict formula in order to comply with AOP Ossau-Iraty conditions in order to guarantee the authenticity of the cheese (breed of ewe, locally produced ewe milk, type of fodder, method of milking, production of the cheese)

Garbure Recipe by Mamie Alice

- 1 ham hock

- 4 confit or conserved duck legs

- 200 gr of carrots
- 200 gr of potatoes
 - 3 leeks
 - 500 gr of white haricot beans
 - 150 gr turnip
 - 2 onions
 - 1/2 a cabbage
- 200 gr of beans (depending on the season)
- bouquet garni, garlic, coarse salt of Salies-de-Béarn and black pepper
 - tomato puree

Method:

Peel the vegetables, clean them and chop roughly.

Put a half-full pot of water on to heat with a handful of Coarse Salt from Salies-de-Béarn and a good pinch of pepper.

As it comes to the boil, add the ham, the vegetables, the bouquet garni, the tomato puree, a spoon of duck fat. Cook over low heat for 2 1/2 hours.

Check from time to time...

When the vegetables are cooked, add the cabbage, duck then the potatoes. After another 1/2 hour of cooking the garbure must be a little thick and bound by the vegetables. Adjust the seasoning at the end of cooking.
