



Navarrenx The bastion city



Navarrenx's tranquil appearance belies a rich and powerful history.

The town has a very important strategic position. Marguerite de Moncade gave it the status of Bastide in 1316

In the 16th century Henri d'Albret, grandfather of the future king Henri IV, decided to fortify the town. He wanted to protect Béarn from the greedy clutches of Spain and France.

An Italian architect, Fabricio Sicilano, built here the first fortified town in France, based on the Italian model. The recently completed ramparts proved themselves in 1569 during an attempt to annexe Béarn by the French troops of Charles IX.

Thanks to the resistance of Navarrenx, ever loyal to Jeanne d'Albret under the command of Baron d'Arros, Béarn was able to maintain its sovereignty. The fortifications are still intact and take you on a journey through time.

Along your walk, you can admire "the most beautiful visages of France": caricatures of the town's shopkeepers and inhabitants.







Discover the first fortified city in France

Leaving the Tourist Office (1), you can see St-Antoine casernes (1), former military barracks built after the fortifications to house up to 500 troopers. The central building is the guardhouse of the Porte St-Antoine (2). The only surviving gateway of the town's two former entrances, it is protected by an orillon, typical of its rounded shape. It cannot be bombarded or attacked head-on. Part of the fortifications of the 16th century, it was originally fitted with a drawbridge. The slots for the chains are still visible. Under the porch, on either side, you can visit 2 rooms: a reconstructed guard room and a room displaying objects from bygone days.

As you return to the square, note the former military prisons on your left. Take the staircase to the left of the Porte St-Antoine to reach **the terrace** (3), overlooking the Gave d'Oloron, famous for its salmon. From here, you can see the 13th-century bridge, originally topped by a toll tower. Directly to your right, you can make out the foundations of Castérasse, the former castle of the Viscounts of Béarn. In the centre, the defensive well is used to operate the arms of the drawbridge. Facing the Gave and above the orillon, a watchtower illustrates its surveillance and defence function.

Leave this part of the ramparts to reach the Bastion de la Cloche 4, just a few steps away. Protecting the bridge and the Porte S¹-Antoine, it offers an excellent viewpoint. The copy of one of Navarrenx's cannons is a reminder of the bastion defence system. This cannon bears the name of the town's motto: "Si you ti baü". This exclamation in Bearnais means "Si moi j'y vais!".

Head for the powder magazine which is the only «gunpowder shop» in the square. It was built in 1580 to free up the sides of the church, which until then had been used for storage. It can hold up to 25,000 pounds of explosives. We invite you to go inside: you'll find a small exhibition explaining the history of gunpowder. Inside, the beautiful stone vault allows sound to circulate diagonally from one corner to the other. A must-try!

Then take rue S'-Antoine, where you will find the Jeanne d'Albret House 6. It is a fine Renaissance residence

with a basket-handle door topped by a triangular pediment. In 1555, Jeanne d'Albret became sovereign of Navarre and Béarn. She adopted the Calvinist religion and brought Béarn into the small group of Protestant states.

Continue on to S'-Germain church 7, which has had an eventful history. Completed in 1562, Jeanne d'Albret converted it into a Protestant temple the following year. In 1620, Louis XIII returned it to Catholic worship. The interior of this late Gothic church is well worth a visit. In particular, the vaults and arches are decorated with sculpted heads, including that of a Compostela pilgrim, illustrating the importance of the route from Le Puy to Navarrenx. At the entrance are beautifully crafted copies of three paintings by Murillo, Dubois and Carracci, donated by Emperor Napoleon III on his visit. Tradition has it that the church has a door reserved for the cagots, of whom there are many in the Navarrenx area.

On leaving the church, walk up the rue des Échos to the Bastion des Contre-mines 3. This bastion is unusual in that it has an underground gallery. It can be visited, and goes down and around the base of the bastion (bring a torch). Follow the path around the bastion to reach the Mont Livet bastion 9, home to the Pierres et Vestiges Theatre, which protects the Porte St-Germain, now destroyed. It is an example of a primitive fortification, with no orillons or withdrawn flanks. The narrow staircase on the right leads to the Poterne de l'Abattoir, which provides an emergency exit in the event of an assault.

Turn right into rue des Échos and continue as far as the Fontaine Militaire (1). Built at the same time as the ramparts, it was the city's only water source at the time. It was an essential asset in the event of a siege. Filled in after a typhoid epidemic in 1952, it was reopened and restored in 1989.

Finally, walk along the rue de la Fontaine towards the Arsenal 11. This former residence of the Kings of Navarre was extensively converted to store weapons, munitions and supplies. Today, this historic building houses the Interpretation Centre which can be visited.



Salies-de-Béarn The city of salt




This small town owes its fame to alt and salt has shaped its history.

Its discovery was attributed to a wild boar that was found next to a spring with its bristles covered in salt. Since then, Salies has looked after its treasures. It is an inexhaustible spring of salt water which provides health and well being. It still belongs to 500 Salisiens known as Part-Prenants. This tradition has carried on since 1587.



There are two quarters; the oldest like the shape of a snail's shell unfolds from the salt well. Here you can find typical houses of the 17th and 18th centuries and narrow streets decked with flowers. In these streets, you'll discover the Museum of Salt and Béarnais Tradition. Nearby, the Thermal quarter has a totally different feel. You are immersed in the Belle Epoque era with the Moorish style Spa, the band stand and the splendid Hotel du Parc, which houses the Salies casino. Together they ooze an old-fashioned charm which appeals to visitors.





Departure from the Tourist Office (1). At the foot of the arcades of an imposing traditional house with a balcony, find the boar fountain (1). Lying in a pit, this work of art by Marc Benard evokes the wild boar of the Salies legend. The animal, wounded during a hunt, was discovered dying, white with salt, in the saltwater marsh. According to the legend, the town was then built around the healing spring. The town's motto is engraved on the fountain wall: "si you nou y eri mourt arès n'y bibéré" (if I hadn't died there, no one would have lived).

Let's meet under the covered market of **the town hall 2**, which used to be the Maison Populaire (1537). Take a look at the explanatory panel where a fun video tells you all about the history of Salies. The ground floor of the town hall was a major centre for the butchers' trade in the Middle Ages and regularly hosts exhibitions. In the centre of the square, imagine the salt spring converted into a pool. It was covered in 1865 with a vault like a church crypt. It was here that, for centuries, the inhabitants, who became Part-Prenants, had the right to draw salt water to bring back to their homes to make salt for salting. On the corner of the rue de la mairie stands the Maison de la Corporation des Part-Prenants (coat of arms with 2 tiradous carrying a sameau). Even today (in June), the Part-Prenants meet there to receive their "sauce", once equivalent to 26 sameaux of salt water for the men.

At the end of the rue de la mairie, turn right up the rue Elysée Coustère to find the rue de Laroumette on your left. Nearby, admire **the Château Saint Pé** 3. This residence, entirely restored by its owner, is one of the first castles in Salies. Leaning against the town's now destroyed ramparts, the building was frequently altered. In the 17th century, it was the seat of a court for witches.

Retrace your steps and turn right into a small square surrounded by typical houses. Hidden away at the end of the square, a narrow passageway (galère or carrerote) leads to **the house of Michel Bergeras** 4. This master carpenter was a cabinetmaker in the Salies school, which developed over three generations in the 18th and 19th centuries. He is said to be a descendant of the cagots, pariahs of the Pyrenees until the French Revolution.

Leave the cul-de-sac and turn right to find **the Pont de la Lune 5**. As you cross the Saleys, admire the half-timbered houses on stilts: the Oustau dou Saleys (contemporary art exhibition centre) on the right bank, and on your left, the emblematic Maison Marrou and its bread oven leaning against the outside wall. Note the red brick and white stone building overlooking the river: built on the ruins of a medieval mill, this former power station was used

primarily to power the lights in the new spa district. Beyond the bridge is the Place Jeanne d'Albret, formerly known as Le Clauson (Salies' first market town). Imagine the covered houses: the upper storey supported by arcades was used to protect the shops, which are no longer there. In the 19th century, the square was lined with tall houses, some of them hotels, with terraces full of travellers. It was one of the strategic locations for the foreign colony until the station was built in 1884. Here, people taking the waters would get off the horse-drawn omnibuses, exhausted after several hours' travel.

Go up the street on your left to discover a fortified church. Salies actually has 2 churches: Saint-Martin on the heights and Saint-Vincent. Protecting the town, **the church of Saint-Vincent** (6) [late 15th century] adjoined the old ramparts. The loopholes and other defensive systems can still be seen here and there. It was here that the jurats debated the laws to be included in the town's black book.

Continue towards the public gardens and Thermal quarter 7, where French and European aristocrats and bourgeois stayed for several seasons [19th century]. Opposite you, before the construction of the thermal baths that you can still visit, was the first industrial salt works. Required to produce 500 tonnes of salt a year, the Salisiens Part-Prenants built the town's first industrial site [1842], protected by a 3-metre-high wooden fence and guarded day and night. Destroyed by fire in 1888, the factory was relocated to the station area a short distance from here.

As the press railed against the insalubrious state of the town, a wave of sanitation work and town planning reorganisation was launched! With boulevard-style avenues framed by plane trees, a public garden planted with unique species of trees and buildings in keeping with Haussmann-style architectural criteria, Salies had all the infrastructure of a health resort worthy of the name: the bandstand (1887), a casino set up in the café cercle du chalet and then in the Hôtel du Parc, a railway station (1884)...

A bathing establishment, whose Hispano-Moorish architecture you can still admire [1888], was built on the ruins of the first saltworks. Around the public garden, the ghosts of the great luxury hotels sit enthroned: the Hôtel de la Paix on your left, frequented by Marcel Proust; on your right, the Hôtel du Parc, which you can still reach by crossing the Boulevard Saint-Guily; at the Sanglier roundabout, the ruins of the Hôtel de France et d'Angleterre.

600 years of history! As you retrace your steps back to the heart of the town, don't hesitate to extend your visit to the Saline and its salt shop, the Musée du Sel et des Traditions Béarnaises and the Place de la Mude, the crypt (former salt water basin), the Hôtel du Parc (Historic Monument), the Protestant temple and the charm of the little streets around the Pont Loumé and the Pont Mayou (a real bend in the road at no. 8). En aban!










«Here you will find some of the most beautiful countryside in France...

... The works of man ooze with force and nobility amongst the splendour of nature. The dreams and reflections of travellers know no limits." This is how Léon Bérard (academician and Mayor during the thirties) described the "pearl of Béarn".

Welcome to a land fashioned by legends. It is a land of mystery that invites discovery. Let your curiosity carry you away for an hour, a day or even longer. Here the slightest detour tells a tale.

This is an ancient moated camp strongly defended inside its stonewalls. Over the centuries it contributed to the maintenance of the sovereignty of Béarn. The gateway to Spain at the foot of the Pyrenees, Sauveterre is surrounded by picturesque countryside.

Since the 10^{th} and 11^{th} centuries pilgrims passing through here have always been greeted with hospitality.





Start your walk on the esplanade of **the Town Hall 1** against the backdrop of the magnificent Pyrenees mountain range. This Renaissance-style building belonged to the powerful Marquis de Nays family, Counts of Salette in the 16th century. It was bought by the town in 1972.

In front of you stands St-André church 2 built at the end of the 12th century. Here, architectural styles mingle. The imposing semi-circular apse framed by two chapels harmoniously supports the building. The Romanesque influence dominates, with beautifully restrained facades in which only three long, narrow windows pierce the wall. The north side is well worth a visit, with its inverted Chrism, corner tower and rose window. Saint-André church is unusual in that it was fortified, as evidenced by its beautiful bell tower, which was once crenellated. It played a key role in the defence of the town.

On the south façade, overlooking the river gave, is the door of the cagots, also known as crestiaas. Mystery surrounds the origins of this community, rejected by the rest of the population. Were they descended from lepers, Visigoths or Saracens? Finally, above the main entrance, the tympanum features magnificent stonework. It features a majestic Christ surrounded by the four evangelists in symbolic form. The interior illustrates the transition between the Romanesque and Gothic styles. The central nave is vaulted with beautiful ribbed vaults. Note the two historiated capitals. The first, at the transept crossing, depicts lying and gluttony. The second, in the north aisle, depicts the Nativity.

Below the Place des Salières is **the Monréal tower 3**. It owes its name to the family who bought it in the 19th century to save it from destruction. This 13th-century defensive tower, 33 m high, is built in the same fine Bidache stonework as the church. Its facades are punctuated by a succession of archways and large bays to the south. It now houses an impressive model of the town, as well as an exhibition on Sauveterre in the Middle Ages.

After taking the stairs, at the foot of the tower, turn right onto the path that runs alongside the Gave. Let yourself be guided by the flow of the river, in the shade of the trees. Walk under the arches of the Pont de la Légende to the footbridge leading to **the île de la Glère** 4, opposite the campsite. Classified as a sensitive natural area, the lle de la Glère is Sauveterre's 4th flagship site, with its protected flora.

Retrace your steps until you reach the fortified bridge known as the Bridge of Legend 5. Built under Gaston VII de Moncade in the 13th century, then remodelled under Fébus in the 14th century, it is the gateway to the kingdom of Navarre. Originally equipped with a drawbridge, it provided access to the Ile de la Glère. In the 18th century, a violent flood swept away part of the bridge, giving it its current appearance. It takes its name from the legend of Queen Sancie. In 1170, she was subjected to the terrible judgment of God in the presence of 3,000 people. Accused of having killed her newborn son, she was thrown, bound hand and foot, into the river Gave. The crowd anxiously waited for the sovereign to be swallowed up. But nothing happened. Sancie rises to the surface and the current gently carries her to the bank. Sancie, exonerated, is cheered by the audience, who are overjoyed.

At the entrance to the bridge, the Chambres du Pont de la Légende, now guest rooms, were once **the pilgrims' hospital 6**. This is where pilgrims could rest at the end of a long day's walk before crossing the bridge and continuing on their way to Compostela.

Go back up through **Lester's Gate** 7. The upper part of this medieval gateway no longer exists, having been replaced by a footbridge. The thickness of its walls nevertheless bears witness to the city's fortifications.

Then take rue Pléguignou as far as the fortified house §. Well placed at the very top of the lane, it offered soldiers a highly strategic location. On the left is the former arsenal §. Now converted into a dwelling house, it was used as a weapons store. It is linked to the beautiful fortified gateway of the Datter (1), which opens up the city to the west. It still retains its ogival shape. At the time, its upper corbels supported the parapet walk and the manoeuvring chamber of a drawbridge needed to cross the moat surrounding the town.

Venture outside the city and you'll immediately see on the left, the remains of the imposing **ramparts** 11.

Go back the way you came and take rue des Innocents via rue Léon Bérard. At the end of this alleyway are the remains of **the Viscount's castle 2** and its barbican. Separated from the castle walls, this artificial stone motte formed the entrance to the castle. Probably built by Gaston VII Moncade, the castle was restored by Gaston Fébus and became his hunting residence. The polygonal ashlar castle was largely destroyed in the 16th century.

Go back up the rue des Innocents to find a charming little tower opposite you, once used as a **dovecote** (3). Many feathered companions still watch over the city today...

Land of history



During the Middle Ages, Béarn was right at the heart of the many turbulent events.

Gaston Fébus, prince of the Pyrenees had a vision of an independent kingdom stretching from the Atlantic to the Mediterranean

He built defences throughout the region of which Sauveterre-de-Béarn is an excellent example.

The fortified stone town wall ensured that Béarn was able to retain its sovereignty over many centuries.



An amazing transformation took place in the town when Henri II d'Albret brought Italian architect Fabricio Siciliano to the town to oversee the construction of its ramparts.

It's thanks to these fortifications that Navarrenx was able to resist attacks from Catholic troops against the Protestant troops. In fact, in the 16th century the Béarn was the only region of France where Calvinism was the official religion: Jeanne d'Albret, Henry IV's mother, was the sovereign.



A legend says that Queen Jeanne d'Albret used to take the waters in Salies-de-Béarn, a city famous thanks to its water ten times saltier than sea water.

The city centre reveals the medieval architecture such as the little streets that interlace to form a snail shell.

Salt, a natural resource

In the Middle Ages, Saliesde-Béarn developed and derived its name from its own natural treasure: salt.

Legend says that Salies' salt was discovered when boar was found covered with white salt. Intensive exploitation of the salt in medieval times brought economic prosperity to the town.

Since 1587, Salies has had a unique, economic and social organisation named "la Corporation des Part-prenants" which is still in existence.

Salt-production in Salies was industrialised in the nineteenth century, and the Saline (Salt Works) now produce 2,000 tonnes of salt a year. The salt from Salies is the only salt allowed in the production of genuine Bayonne ham ("Jambon de Bayonne").

The Salt Works may be viewed from the exterior free of charge. You will be provided with boards which tell you everything you need to know about the plant and the processes involved in the crystallisation of the salt water. At certain times you can also see the harvesting of salt by hand (Opening times vary according to production schedules).

Museum area: with an audio guide in English you will learn about the history of the Saline (the wild boar legend, growth of the town, etc.). The visit ends with a tasting of Bayonne ham, salted with Salies salt

Last admission to the Museum area at 11am and 4.30pm.

Set in the « Darremoudine », a typical 17th century house, the museum offers a unique visit tracing over 4000 years of history.

The crypt

The Bayaà crypt, constructed in the 1860's covers the source of salty water, exploited since the Middle Ages. The elegant stone are tastefully floodlit to highlight their beauty.

Nearby

In 1292 Countess Marguerite de Moncade founded **Labastide Villefranche**. Traces of its bastide Character can still be seen. The Town Hall was built incorporating the arches. In the 14th century a fortified tower was constructed and its ruins still overlook the Pounte lake.

The village of **Lahontan** meaning "the fountain" possesses three fountains to which miraculous healing powers have been attributed. The Chapelle Notre Dame d'Abet was erected in the Middle Ages after the discovery in a copse of a statue of the virgin Mary.



Defensive architecture

The architectural heritage of Béarn des Gaves bears testimony to troubled times during the Middle Ages. Sauveterre-de-Béarn and Navarrenx have all preserved elements of their fortifications.

The «Pont de la Légende» and the «tour Monréal» in Sauveterre-de-Béarn, were part of the town's hillside defence. Thanks to these buildings and its environment, Sauveterre-de-Béarn is recognised as a « Petite Cité de Caractère ».

Navarrenx is remarkable in terms of its fortifications. Built in the 16th century, it still has its imposing ten-meter-high ramparts, listed as Historic Monuments.

The defence bastions, as well as various military buildings such as the Arsenal and the Saint-Antoine barracks, have earned Navarrenx one of the highest accolades - it is one of the "Most beautiful villages in France".

The nearby village of Audaux, has preserved and restored its communal village laundry, opposite the church of St Vincent. The Château de Gassion in the village was built between the 12th and 13th centuries but was partly burned down in 1560 during the religious wars. The present building dates back to 1650 and is now home to a private school.

You can see some different styles of Béarnais architecture in the village of Castetnau-Camblong and note the stone bridges in the surrounding area dating back to Roman times.







Walks

On the paths of the Camino de Santiago

Follow in the footsteps of the thousands of pilgrims who walk the Way of Saint James. Walk alongside them, take your pilgrim's staff and get to know the countryside and the pilgrims, as you rediscover yourself...

Three of the four principal routes used by the pilgrims pass through the Béarn des Gaves : the Vézelay Route, the Puy-en-Velay Route and the Tours Route.

Walking on the paths of Béarn des Gaves

A land of contrasting landscapes, criss-crossed by the Oloron river, mountain streams and seductive countryside where you're never far from nature in all her splendour.

Against a backdrop of the Pyrenees, you'll discover a rural heritage of daily life in the past as you pass through the forests and valleys.







Garbure Recipe by Mamie Alice

- 1 ham hock

- 4 confit or conserved duck legs

- 200 gr of carrots

- 200 gr of potatoes

- 3 leeks

- 500 gr of white haricot beans

- 150 ar turnip

- 2 onions

- 1/2 a cabbage

- 200 gr of beans (depending on the season)

- bouquet garni, garlic, coarse salt of Salies-de-Béarn and black pepper

- tomato puree

Method:

Peel **the vegetables**, clean them and chop roughly.

Put a half-full pot of water **on to heat** with a handful of Coarse Salt from Salies-de-Béarn and a good pinch of pepper.

As it comes to the boil, **add the ham**, the vegetables, the bouquet garni, the tomato puree, a spoon of duck fat. **Cook over low heat** for 2 1/2 hours.

Check from time to time...

When the vegetables are cooked, add the cabbage, duck then the potatoes. After another 1/2 hour of cooking **the garbure** must be a little thick and bound by the vegetables. Adjust the seasoning at the end of cooking.
